





Since it was established in 1969, the Bermuda National Trust has acquired more than 60 historic properties and open-space areas in Bermuda, and is a formidable force in the preservation of this fragile island, characterized by graceful Georgian houses of whitewashed coral limestone, manicured gardens, and sparkling turquoise waters. In 1612, settlers from Britain entered St. George's Harbor resulting in a unique blend of British formality and island nonchalance. Discover Bermuda in all its cultural glory with VIP tours of historic monuments, special openings of grand private homes, and exclusive invitations into breathtaking hidden gardens. Taking place during the Bermuda National Trust's festive "Christmas Walkabout," uncover Bermuda at its best, while enjoying many of the island's most interesting people and finest restaurants.

TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 29

*Welcome to
Historic Bermuda*

Arrive at the Bermuda airport and take an airport shuttle to the four-star Pompano Beach Club, located on a stunning ocean cliffside. Join study leader John Meffert for an introductory talk about Bermuda and celebrate your first night with a welcome dinner at the hotel. (D)

WEDNESDAY, NOVEMBER 30

*Carter House
& St. George*

Set out for historic St. George, Bermuda's capital until 1815 and arguably the oldest continuously inhabited English town in the New World. Enjoy a walking tour along St. George's narrow streets to see King's Square; the Town Hall; *Deliverance*, a replica of one of two ships built by shipwrecked settlers; and St. Peter's Church, the oldest Anglican church

in continuous use in the western hemisphere. At the 18th-century Tucker House, view Bermudian furniture, portraits, hand-sewn quilts, and silver. Next, drive to a spectacular private home and enjoy lunch with the owners. Proceed to Carter House, one of the oldest buildings on St. David's Island. An example of early Bermudian vernacular architecture, it was built circa 1640 of stone rather than wood by the descendants of one of two crew members of the shipwrecked *Sea Venture* who remained in Bermuda when other survivors left for Virginia in 1610. Dinner is included at the hotel. (B,L,D)

THURSDAY, DECEMBER 1

*Estates, Antiques
& the Christmas
Walkabout*

Drive to Waterville, one of the oldest and most elegant houses on Bermuda, and the Bermuda National Trust's

current headquarters. The waterfront grounds include the Bermuda Rose Society's showcase garden of old roses. Continue to one of the most splendid private historic estates in Bermuda, then visit Vermont, a unique example of early Georgian architecture built around 1710, which has remained virtually unchanged for 300 years and houses a collection of Bermuda-made cedar furniture, portraits, and English and Chinese porcelain. At the Bermuda Natural History Museum, learn about the island's unique geological history and diversity of habitats and see the museum's 140,000-gallon North Rock Exhibit that showcases live corals and 200 species of fish, including large predatory fish. Continue to Hamilton, Bermuda's capital, for free time to enjoy lunch and explore the city. Following free time for lunch and an afternoon at leisure,

return to St. George to take in the festive celebrations of the Bermuda National Trust's Christmas Walkabout. Dinner is included at the hotel. (B,D)

FRIDAY, DECEMBER 2

Royal Dockyards

Discover the Royal Naval Dockyard on a special walking tour led by the Bermuda National Trust. Visit the National Museum of Bermuda, housed within a large fortress and dedicated to Bermuda's maritime history. During a private visit to the Commissioner's House, learn about the largest restoration project ever undertaken in Bermuda. Following a sunset cocktail cruise, enjoy dinner together at the hotel. (B,D)

SATURDAY, DECEMBER 3

Art & Ancestry

Set out for Camden and explore highlights from the 36-acre Bermuda Botanical Gardens, featuring native palmetto trees, rose and hibiscus gardens, and banyan and ficus trees. Enjoy a curator-led tour of the Masterworks Museum of Bermuda Art, with a world-class collection including works by Henry Moore, Georgia O'Keeffe, and Winslow Homer. Continue to another private home with magnificent gardens and be treated to lunch hosted by the owner, a sixth-generation Bermudian. This evening, bid farewell to Bermuda during a memorable dinner. (B,L,D)

SUNDAY, DECEMBER 4

Departures

After a morning at leisure, take a shuttle to the airport for return flights to the United States. (B)

**Tour price is per person based on double occupancy, with a minimum of 15 paying participants.*

Activity Level: Moderate, good overall mobility required.

Deposit & Final Payment: A deposit of \$1,000 per registrant is required to reserve space on the tour, of which \$500 is nonrefundable for ISDI's registration and planning fee unless the tour is cancelled due to low enrollment. This deposit may be paid by check or by Visa or MasterCard. Final balance will be invoiced and is due on August 18, 2022 and must be paid by check to International Seminar Design, Inc. Registrations are accepted after this date on a space-available basis with payment in full by check only.

Flights: Airfare is not included in the tour price. Participants are responsible for all aspects of their round-trip air arrangements. Please do not purchase airline tickets until operation of the tour is confirmed by ISDI.

Tour Inclusions: 5 nights at the four-star Pompano Beach Club (superior rooms); breakfast daily, 2 lunches, 5 dinners, access to 3 beautiful private homes; a sunset cocktail cruise; airport shuttle transfers; academic leadership of John Meffert; services of an ISDI tour director; land transportation by private coach and public ferry; gratuities to local guides, drivers, and hotel porters; entrance fees to sites per itinerary; bottled water daily; taxes, services, and portage fees.

Tour Exclusions: Airfare, airline taxes, and fuel surcharges; airport portage; private airport transfers; excursions, activities, or meals during traveler's free time; personal items; personal services; travel extensions; personal insurance for health, baggage, and tour cancellation; passport fees; visa fees; gratuities for hotel housekeeping staff.

Terms and Conditions: ISDI requires that all tour participants be fully vaccinated against COVID-19 to participate on the tour. Upon receipt of registration, ISDI will send registrant a Participant Tour Agreement detailing the full terms and conditions for this tour. This document must be signed and returned to ISDI before participant's registration is considered complete and any arrangements can be confirmed.

Cancellations & Refunds: Cancellation by participant must be made in writing to ISDI and is effective only upon acknowledged receipt by ISDI. There is a non-refundable registration and planning fee of \$500 per person regardless of cancellation date. Written cancellation received by ISDI on or before August 18, 2022: full refund minus \$500 per person registration and planning fee. Written cancellation received by ISDI between August 19 and October 13, 2022: full refund minus \$1,600 per person cancellation fee (includes registration and planning fee). Written cancellation received by ISDI on or after October 14, 2022: no refund. Tour registration is non-transferable. In the case of cancellation, substitutions are not allowed. After the tour has commenced, no refunds will be issued for any reason including, but not limited to, unused portions of tour. If the tour is cancelled by ISDI or National Trust Tours due to low enrollment, active registrants will receive a full refund of all tour payments.

Travel Insurance: Travel Insurance is not included in the tour cost, but participants are strongly encouraged to purchase a travel protection plan in conjunction with this tour, including coverage of trip cancellation, trip interruption, emergency evacuation/repatriation, medical expenses, lost or damaged baggage, and other expenses and/or losses incurred due to unexpected situations. Should a participant cancel at any time after registering for the tour, ISDI must strictly abide by the cancellation policy outlined herein.
